What is the 2024 Waterworks Construction Accident Prevention Action Plan

The Tokyo Metropolitan Government Bureau of Waterworks has formulated the “Waterworks Construction Accident Prevention Plan 2024” which sets out the action targets for the next three years (FY 2024 to FY 2026), with the aim of further promoting the action plans created in FY 2012. These action targets have been formulated by the Bureau of Waterworks to prevent accidents in waterworks construction for the planning period covering FY 2024 to FY 2026.

This Action Plan aims to analyze the causes of past accidents and to implement measures to reduce any additional construction accidents. The plan also specifies the following measures. Please use this to instruct designated businesses and contractors.

Action Goals

- **Less than 8** construction accidents of Level 1 or higher each year
- **Zero fatal accidents** throughout the year
- **Zero accidents each year** of Level 1 or higher resulting in injury caused by **construction machinery**

Key Measures

- Strengthening efforts to reduce accidents caused by vehicle-mounted construction machinery
- Strengthening efforts to reduce the frequency of accidents (new)
- Educational support for contractors (subcontractors) and supervisors
